

Louisiana Service and Leadership Minor Requirements [LASAL]

Incoming students will be automatically enrolled in the Honors minor. Those who wish to deepen their experience as it pertains to leadership roles in Louisiana in the fields of public service, social justice, and environmental sustainability may opt into the LASAL minor or LASAL Research minor.

Admission to the minor is at the discretion of the college. To apply, students must attend an informational meeting, complete an application, and undertake an interview. Admission is not guaranteed. All students must be in good standing in the Honors College to declare and receive the LASAL minor (3.0 GPA and successfully complete a minimum of two Honors courses (5-6 hours) per academic year in residence.)
